## Chengdu Overview

Chengdu is located in Southwest China. With a long history and varieties of cultural heritage, it is one of the first historical and cultural cities in China, known as the "Land of Abundance", "Jiangnan in Sichuan", and "Suzhou and Hangzhou in Sichuan".

It has a subtropical moist monsoon climate with four distinct seasons, and mild summers and winters.

It is located on the Chuanxi Plain, the largest plain in Southwest China. It borders Longquan Mountain in the east and Qinghai Mountain in the west. In the west, Longmen Mountain runs from south to north. This region features flat terrain, crisscrossed

12,098 square kilometers.

By the end of 2012, the permanent population was 14.18 million.

Administrative Divisions

Chengdu comprises 9 municipal districts and 4 county-level cities and 6 counties. The City Hall is located in High-tech Zone District.

## Historical Sites of Chengdu

### Du Fu Thatched Cottage

Du Fu Thatched Cottage is a museum renovated from the former house of Du Fu, a famous poet of the Tang Dynasty. Integrating the designs of a memorial clan temple and the former residence of the poet, it includes the Hall of History in Poems, Temple for Ministry of Works and Shaojing Tablet Pavilion.

### Temple of Marquis Wu

Temple of Marquis Wu, also known as "Zhaoile Temple of Han", is a temple where sacrifices were made for the Emperor Liu Bei, Prime Minister Zhuge Liang and other heroes of the Shu Han during the Three Kingdoms period. It is the only temple for simultaneous sacrifice to both emperor and ministers of China, honored as the "Shrine of Three Kingdoms".

## Kuan and Zhai Alleys

The Kuan and Zhai Alleys were built during the late Kangxi period of the Qing Dynasty. They are an old city block composed of three parallel alleys, Kuan Alley, Zhai Alley and Jing Alley, with courtyard communities between them. They represent the distinct regional characteristics of modern Chengdu, symbolic of the rich Bashu culture.

### Kuan Alley

Kuan Alley, representing the most typical urban folk culture of Chengdu, is a good place for tourists to experience the daily life of Chengdu's indigenous residents. Exclusive door heads, parasol trees and the old teahouse under the cornice etc. make up the unique elements of Kuan Alley.

## Ancient Towns of Chengdu

### Huanglongxi Ancient Town

Huanglongxi Ancient Town is a small tourist-oriented town with a history of more than 1,700 years. In the ancient town, buildings dating back to the Ming and Qing dynasties can be found everywhere. The 200 meter Huanglong Central Street alone has three temples along it: Gulong Temple, Chaoyin Temple and Zhenjiang Temple.

### Luodai Ancient Town

Luodai Ancient Town is the only ancient Hakka town in West China, renowned as "the first town of Hakka under heaven". In the town, the old alleys are crisscrossed and formed in a layout of "one street and seven alleys". The simple and quaint folk houses are distributed along the alleys in proper order.

### Anren Ancient Town

## Transportation

- By Air**  
Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport is located on Xihanggang Street, Shuangliu County, Chengdu City. 18 kilometers from Chengdu's urban district, it is a state-level aviation hub. More than 130 domestic scheduled airlines and 50 international (regional) airlines are open for navigation to Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Chongqing, Luoyang, Fuzhou, Urumqi, New York (USA), London (UK), Paris (France) and other cities.
- By Train**  
Chengdu boasts a developed railway system and is the largest railway hub in the Southwest region. Five electrified arterial railway lines, the Chengdu-Chongqing line, Baogui-Chengdu line, Chengdu-Kunming line, Dazhou-Chengdu Line and Chengdu-Suining line, join up in Chengdu. At present, it has three railway stations: the North Railway Station, South Railway Station and East Railway Station.  
Chengdu North Railway Station mainly has trains departing to Beijing, Nanjing, Shenyang, Shanghai and Xi'an. The East Railway Station is located at 4th Wanke Road, Baohu Street, Chenghua District, and has

## Kuan and Zhai Alleys

### Jing Alley

Jing Alley was an area of "new life", named after an ancient well excavated during the reign of Emperor Kangxi in the Qing Dynasty. It reveals the modern life style in Chengdu. The Western-style buildings are the most characteristic architecture in Jing Alley. The French style building testifies to Chengdu's all-embracing openness.

## Urban Leisure

### Eastern Music Park

Chengdu Eastern Music Park is a charming block integrating industrial techniques and stylish music. The park, once the former site of the state-owned Honguang Electron Tube Factory, is a new emblem of Chengdu tourism.

### Shunxing Old Tea House

Located at Xishu Covered Bridge, No. 166, Shijicheng Road, Wuhou District, the old-style teahouse is brimming with the rich folk customs of Sichuan. The home-style dishes served here are all delicious. After 8 p.m., Sichuan Opera, Erhu, face-changing and other feature performances are available. Ordering a pot of tea, a few Chengdu Snacks and enjoying the food and performance is an enjoyable experience. This is the perfect place for tourists to feel the characteristics of Chengdu.

## Dining

- Jinli Food Street**  
Jinli Food Street is located beside the Temple of Marquis Wu. There are dozens of small restaurants which provide all of Chengdu's famous snacks. One can also enjoy various unique folk performances while savouring the many snacks.
- World Food Street**  
World Food Street is a food street that represents Chengdu's cuisine culture and quality. It boasts a diversity of cultural cuisine heritages and many famous flagship restaurants.

## Mount Qingcheng

Mount Qingcheng is one of China's four famous Taoist mountains. The main peak, Laoxiaoding, is 1,260 meters above sea level. Among famous mountains in Sichuan, it is on par with the steep Jiannan Mountain, the Emei Mountain and the Kuimen Mountain, and enjoys a high reputation of "the most secluded mountain under heaven".

### Tianshi Cave

The existing palaces of Tianshi Cave were built in the late Qing Dynasty. They are the triple Sanqing Hall, Sanhuang Hall and Huangdi Temple. Inside Tianshi Cave, statues of "Heavenly Master" Zhang Daoling and his 30th generation descendant "Master Xujiang" are found.

### Shangqing Palace

In front of Shangqing Palace a majestic stone column is erected, attached with a tablet reading "Shangqing Palace of Mount

## Dujiangyan Irrigation System

Dujiangyan Irrigation System is located on the main stream of the Minjiang River at the foot of Mount Qingcheng. It is the grand water conservancy work with the longest history, and is the longest preserved one in the world. It is unique as a large water project that diverts water without a dam.

### Yuzui Diversion Dike

Located at the center of the Minjiang River bend, Yuzui Diversion Dike divides the Minjiang River into two channels. The left one is known as the main stream of Minjiang River, and is mainly used to drain off floodwaters. The right one along the foot of the mountain is called the Inner River, and is an artificial diversion channel used for irrigation.

### Feisha Weir

Feisha Weir is a long dike under Yuzui Diversion Dike, which is a dike dividing the Inner River and Outer River.

## Shopping

As a land of abundance, Chengdu enjoys rich natural resources and products. Sichuan embroidery is known as one of the four Famous Embroideries together with Hunan embroidery, Jiangsu embroidery and Guangdong embroidery, and has a reputation of "No. 1 under Heaven". Qingcheng Silk Carpet and Pixian County broad bean sauce are also local products.

- Chunxi Road Shopping Street**  
Chunxi Road is the most representative and the most bustling shopping pedestrian street, known as one of the top 10 shopping streets in China. It gathers various street trends and brands, traditional Chinese

## Mount Qingcheng

### Laojun Pavilion

Laojun Pavilion is located at the summit of the first peak of Mount Qingcheng. Inside the pavilion, a statue of Master Lao Zi is enshrined, which was created based on the original script of "the purple air comes from the east", a posthumous work created by Xu Beihong.

### Tai'an Ancient Town

Tai'an Ancient Town is located behind Mount Qingcheng with the Weijiang River flowing around the town. On both sides of the street and in the middle of two streets are uniformly carved Western-style buildings.

## Xiling Snow Mountain

5,364 meters above sea level, Xiling Snow Mountain is the first peak of Chengdu. It consists of a front hill and a rear hill. The front hill is suitable for backpackers who are fond of climbing and hiking while the rear hill has a skiing resort and grass skiing field.

### Red Rock Tip

Located 3,310 meters above sea level, the Red Rock Tip is made up of three 300 to 400 red granite pillar-like peaks. The peaks are towering and steep, offering a wonderful view.

### Snow Mountain Skiing Resort

The Snow Mountain Skiing Resort is located at the rear hill. It is praised as the "Eastern Alps" as it has the latitude similar with the Alps. The skiing resort boasts seven international standard skiing trails which can accommodate 2,000 persons for skiing and amusement.

## Other attractions

### Tianfu Square

Tianfu Square is located in the center of Chengdu City. It is divided into Eastern and Western parts by the curve in the center of the Taiji Bagua Cloud Atlas. The square has a Golden Sun Bird statue, the Taiji cloud atlas of fish eye and the soaring dragon fountain, 12 totem poles and other sights.

### Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding

Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding is a scenic spot integrating tourism and scientific research, built for rescuing
